In Northern Ireland, *Using ICT* is a cross-curricular skill within the revised curriculum at Key Stage 3, and a feature of Learning Outcomes in all subjects.

There are slight differences in the wording of the Learning Outcomes from subject to subject. For reference, the wording below is extracted from English with Media Education. It therefore provides a guide to the key Learning Outcomes in all subjects, covered in each School Report lesson plan.

Lesson 1 What is news?	Pupils should be able to communicate effectively in oral, visual and written formats (including ICT and the moving image) showing clear awareness of audience and purpose and attention to accuracy.
Lesson 2 Finding and gathering the news.	Pupils should be able to research and manage information effectively, including Using Mathematics and Using ICT where appropriate.
Lesson 3 Writing a news report.	Pupils should be able to communicate effectively in oral, visual and written formats (including ICT and the moving image) showing clear awareness of audience and purpose and attention to accuracy.
Lesson 4 Assembling a news report.	Pupils should be able to show deeper understanding by thinking critically and flexibly, solving problems and making informed decisions, demonstrating Using Mathematics and Using ICT where appropriate.
Lesson 5 Ordering the news.	Pupils should be able to show deeper understanding by thinking critically and flexibly, solving problems and making informed decisions, demonstrating Using Mathematics and Using ICT where appropriate.
Lesson 6 Broadcasting the news.	Pupils should be able to communicate effectively in oral, visual and written formats (including ICT and the moving image) showing clear awareness of audience and purpose and attention to accuracy.
